**Visible Network Labs is seeking two temporary research assistants with expertise in social determinants of health and use of research evidence or data use for a short-term project. The research assistants will be expected to each work approximately 10-15 hours a week for three months, starting at the end of January with an anticipated end date in mid-April. These positions pay up to \$25/hr.** Previous experience with qualitative data analysis, coding text data, and systematic reviewing are a plus for this role.

**The two research assistants will:**

- Extract high level data from scholarly and gray literature to identify key document characteristics using a code book.
- Engage in a detailed review of selected items from the literature to assign codes and extract data using a codebook.
- Maintain an audit trail documenting the data extracting and coding process.

The data extraction will be part of a larger network mapping project focused on understanding how scholarly and practice audiences are using a set of data tools for understanding local health and social determinants of health at the local scale. There may be opportunities for publication or other outputs related to this project depending on the interest of the research assistant.

The research assistants will work with an internationally known team of network scientists and technology developers, in a supportive and collaborative team environment under the direction of Dr. Amanda Beacom. This position is virtual, although the VNL team generally works on Mountain Standard Time.
